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Paṭhamaparisuddhasuttaṃ	Perfectly Pure - part 1
Sāvatthinidānam:	This was explained in Sāvatthi:
"Atthime, bhikkhave, dhammā parisuddhā pariyodātā anangaṇā vigatūpakkilesā anuppannā uppajjanti.	"There are, O' Bhikkhus, eight Dhammas that are utterly pure and completely spotless, without any stain left on them and undefiled.
Nāññatra tathāgatassa pātubhāvā arahato sammāsambuddhassa.	They have not arisen before and arise only when the Tathāgata, an Arahant, the Sammāsambuddha appears.
Katame aṭṭha?	What are these eight?
Seyyathidam— sammādiţţhipe sammāsamādhi.	They are right view, right thought, right speech, right action, right livelihood, right effort, right awareness and right concentration.
Ime kho, bhikkhave, aṭṭha dhammā parisuddhā pariyodātā anaṅgaṇā vigatūpakkilesā anuppannā uppajjanti.	These are O' Bhikkhus, eight Dhammas that are utterly pure and completely spotless, without any stain left on them and undefiled.
Nāññatra tathāgatassa pātubhāvā arahato sammāsambuddhassā"ti.	They have not arisen before and arise only when the Tathāgata, an Arahant, the Sammāsambuddha appears."
