Musāvādasuttam

Vuttañhetam bhagavatā, vuttamarahatā me sutam–
 “Ekadhammam atītassa, bhikkhave, purisapuggalassa nāham tassa kiñci
 pāpakammañ akarañyanti vadāmi. Katamam ekadhammam? Yadidam bhikkhave,
 sampajānamusāvādo”ti. Etamattham bhagavā avoca. Tatthetam iti vuccati:

Ekadhammam atītassa, musāvādissa jantuno;
 vitiññaparalokassa, natthi pāpam akāriyan”ti.

Ayampi attho vutto bhagavatā, iti me sutanti.

atītassa	atīta + gen.	past; overstepping, transgressing
jantuno	(gen./dat.)	man, person
tīṇna	tarati (pp.)	overcome, crossed
purisapuggalassa	purisa + puggala + gen.	man + individual
vitiññaparalokassa	vi + tīṇna + para + lokassa	having overcome the other world
sampajānamusāvādo	sampajāna + musāvādo	deliberate + false speech: intentional lie
